Grants to Support Social Need (Hedley Foundation)

Amount available: Grants up to £5,000

Deadline: 13 December 2023

<u>Eligibility:</u> Small to mid-sized registered charities that are based and working in the UK.

<u>Aims:</u> To support smaller charitable organisations undertaking projects for young people, the disabled, terminally ill patients and others in need.

Grants to Support Youth-Led Social Action Across the UK (Co-op Foundation)

Amount available: Grants up to£20,000

Deadline: 14 December 2024

<u>Eligibility:</u> Groups or individuals proposing or leading social action work that has a clear purpose and has an income of less than £250,000.

<u>Aims:</u> To deliver youth-led projects and activities that are committed to making local communities safe, inclusive, and sustainable.

Windrush Day Grant Scheme (Department for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities)

Amount available: Grants between £5,000 to £50,000

Deadline: 17 December 2023

<u>Eligibility:</u> Local authorities, charities, community interest companies/organisations, social enterprises, community benefit societies.

<u>Aims:</u> Bringing communities together across different ages and ethnic backgrounds to commemorate, celebrate and educate their local area about the contribution of the Windrush Generation and their descendants across the United Kingdom.

Grants to Help People Through Pets (Pets Foundation)

Amount available: Grants between £250 to £50,000

<u>Deadline</u>: 22 December 2023

<u>Eligibility:</u> Registered charities working with domestic pets who have been operating for at least two years.

<u>Aims:</u> To support charities who provide temporary or ongoing assistance to ensure pets can remain with their owners, and/or change the lives of adults and children through the provision of animal-based activities.

<u>Grants to Develop Strong Communities (Ashley Family Foundation)</u>

Amount available: Grants up to £10,000. The grant must represent at least 10% of the overall project cost.

Deadline: 22 December 2023

<u>Eligibility:</u> Available for small-scale arts and/or community and social welfare projects.

<u>Aims:</u> To support community museums, farms, gardens, schools and other charitable organisations with small-scale arts and community projects, with a particular emphasis on supporting rural communities.

Grants to Support the Advancement of Education,
Culture, Heritage and Science (Britford Bridge Trust)

Amount available: Grants between £10,000 to £30,000

Deadline: 31 December 2023

<u>Eligibility:</u> Applications are invited from UK registered charities for national or international projects. Regional consideration will only be given to projects in the Wolverhampton, Dorset and Cambridge areas.

<u>Aims:</u> To support the prevention or relief of poverty, the advancement of education, health, arts, culture, heritage, or science.

Grants to Support Grassroots Sports Clubs (Greene King)

Amount available: Grants up to £4,000

Deadline: 31 December 2023

<u>Eligibility:</u> Available to a wide range of organisations. Priority will be given to those that can demonstrate how their sports club or project benefits members of the local community.

<u>Aims:</u> To support and promote grassroots sport within local communities by supporting people and projects that run sports activities that positively impact the local community.

<u>The Weston Charity Awards (Garfield Weston Foundation and Pilotlight)</u>

Amount available: Package of support up to £22,000

Deadline: 10 January 2024

<u>Eligibility:</u> Registered charities over two years old with an income of less than £5 million per year.

<u>Aims:</u> To support ambitious front-line charities working in community, welfare, youth, and environment to instigate strategic change and accelerate innovative growth.

<u>Grants for Capital Projects in Secondary Schools and Sixth Form Colleges (Wolfson Foundation)</u>

Amount available: Grants between £15,000 to £100,000

Deadline: 10 January 2024

<u>Eligibility:</u> Schools must be state-funded, have at least two years of exam results available and have been inspected by Ofsted / Estyn / HMIE / ETI and have an overall outcome of 'Good' or above.

<u>Aims:</u> To support high-achieving state-funded secondary schools and sixth form colleges to improve the teaching at GCSE and A-Level of subjects that need specialist spaces and equipment.

Ashden Awards for Sustainable Energy

Amount available: Grants up to £25,000

Deadline: 25 January 2024

<u>Eligibility:</u> Businesses, NGOs, government organisations, social enterprises and community groups.

<u>Aims:</u> To persuade policy makers, funders and the wider public to recognise renewable energy as a tool for addressing the urgent global issues of climate change, pollution and energy supply, as well as the social and economic needs of local communities.

Grants to to Support Employment Opportunities for Partners of Serving Armed Forces Personnel (Armed Forces Covenant Fund Trust)

Amount available: Grants between £30,000 and £80,000

Deadline: 25 January 2024

<u>Eligibility:</u> Registered charities, community interest companies, armed forces units, or UK universities.

<u>Aims:</u> To provide funding to projects that will improve support for service partners and spouses regarding the skills and experiences they bring to the workplace.

Grants to Connect Archives with Local Communities (The National Archives)

Amount available: Grants up to£5,000

Deadline: 26 January 2024

<u>Eligibility:</u> Available to museums and other public bodies, registered charities and not for profit organisations that hold collections in England and Wales.

<u>Aims:</u> To support projects that will engage with new and existing audiences in the places and communities where archives are located.

Grants to Support End of Life Care for People Dying at Home (St James Place Charitable Foundation)

Amount available: Grants up to£40,000

Deadline: 29 January 2024

<u>Eligibility:</u> Available to adult and children's hospices that are members of Hospice UK.

<u>Aims:</u> To help UK hospices provide palliative and end-of-life care for people who are terminally ill and dying at home.

Grants to Support Canoeing and Inland Waterway Conservation

Amount available: Grants between £500 to £10,000

Deadline: 31 January 2024

<u>Eligibility:</u> Anyone in the UK with an active interest in improving access to water and protecting the environment, including paddling clubs, community groups, parish councils and local authorities.

<u>Aims:</u> To promote new or improved access points for canoe trails on to moving water, estuaries, canals and reservoirs.

Grants to Support Children and Families (Tesco Stronger Starts)

Amount available: Grants up to £1,500

Deadline: Rolling programme every 3 months

<u>Eligibility:</u> Includes but not limited to schools, voluntary or community organisations, health bodies, Parish/Town Councils, local authorities and social housing providers.

<u>Aims:</u> Open to all local causes, but are currently prioritising projects that support children's food security and health and local store nominated good causes.

Amount available: Grants up to £2,000

<u>Deadline</u>: No deadline

<u>Eligibility:</u> Businesses based in the Basildon District Council area (Basildon, Pitsea, Laindon, Billericay & Wickford).

<u>Aims:</u> To help Basildon businesses grow. It is not intended to be a survival grant or to provide a means to repay other indebtedness.
